



Visiting Hours

3 PM to 7 PM, Sunday – Saturday

- Visits are limited to one person at a time for no more than **ONE HOUR** per day per patient, unless otherwise authorized by the Hospital for example, any patient in isolation
- Patients undergoing same day surgery or other procedures may bring a companion who may remain with the patient through the initial intake process; and may rejoin the patient following the procedure for the discharge process
- Visitors may not be present during procedures and in the recovery room except for pediatrics, childbirth, and patients with an intellectual, developmental, or other cognitive disability
- Visitors will be provided with appropriate personal protective equipment and must wear and follow the instructions provided on how to put on and remove the item(s)
- Appropriate face covering at all times...No eating in patient rooms
- Visitors must undergo symptom and temperature checks upon entering the facility and shall be denied entry if they report significant COVID-19 exposure or symptoms during the prior 14 days or have a temperature equal to or greater than 100.0 degrees Fahrenheit
- Once in the facility, visitors must remain in the patient's room throughout the visit except when directed by hospital staff to leave
- All visitors must be 18 years of age or older except in rare occasions as determined by Woodhull

REVISED VISITATION POLICY EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

To prevent the spread of COVID-19: Effective February 15, 2021, patient visitation at NYC Health + Hospitals/Woodhull is being gradually reinstated in compliance with the Governor's Executive Order and the NYSDOH directives

Special Situation Visitation: 24/7

- When medically necessary and visitor is essential to the patient's care;
- The visitor is a family member or legal representative of a patient in an imminent end-of-life situation; or
- For a visitor of a woman in labor, an infant in the neonatal ICU, or a pediatric patient.

Any "Special Situation" visitor, must be screened for symptoms (cough, shortness of breath, temperature, etc.) or potential exposure to someone with COVID-19 prior to entering the hospital. Visitors who exhibit COVID-19 symptoms, or who have potentially had exposure to someone with COVID-19 will not be permitted to visit patients.
