### Get Vaccinated!

- **The COVID-19 vaccines save lives.** When you get vaccinated, you are helping to protect yourself from COVID-19 and making your community safer. If you've had COVID-19, it is still important to get vaccinated. You should wait until you are recovered from COVID-19 and have completed isolation to avoid exposing other people at the vaccination site while you may be contagious. All people who live, work, or study in New York City are eligible to be vaccinated in NYC, with some age limits. - **Would you like to get the COVID-19 vaccine at home?** We can schedule today a COVID-19 vaccine at home for you and anyone else in your household ages 12 and up. Please call us at **212-242-2692** and press **3**.
- **New Yorkers can also get free tickets, memberships, and gifts for getting vaccinated against COVID-19.** These giveaways will be available for a limited time. Find out more at [nyc.gov/vaccineincentives](https://nyc.gov/vaccineincentives).



### Paid Leave for Vaccination

- New Yorkers can receive up to four hours of paid leave for each vaccine dose, four hours total for a single dose vaccine or eight hours total for a two-dose vaccine. This leave is paid at the employee's regular rate of pay, and cannot be charged against any other leave. If you feel any side effects from your vaccination, you may use any accrued sick leave to recover.



### COVID-19 Treatment

- **Are treatments available for COVID-19?**
  - » **Yes!** For people with certain underlying medical conditions, treatment with monoclonal antibodies is safe and effective at preventing



hospitalization. This treatment is free through NYC Health + Hospitals, even if you do not have insurance.

### ■ **What are monoclonal antibodies?**

» When you get sick, your body makes antibodies to fight the infection. Monoclonal antibodies mimic your body's natural response to fighting an infection. The treatment works best as soon as you start to feel sick, so please call today!

### ■ **Am I eligible for treatment?**

» Monoclonal antibodies work best in people who have COVID-19 symptoms and have certain underlying medical conditions. You are eligible for treatment if:

- You have a positive test for COVID-19
- You have COVID-19 symptoms that are mild to moderate
- You weigh at least 88 lbs (40 kg)
- You are:
  - Age 65+
  - Age 12+ and have a high risk of developing severe disease. High risk conditions include, but are not limited to, heart disease, lung disease, kidney disease, pregnancy, being overweight or obese, diabetes, immunocompromising conditions, sickle cell disease, and neurodevelopmental conditions. Please contact a medical professional to discuss if this treatment is right for you.

## **Emergency Rental Assistance Program**

■ New Yorkers in low or moderate income households can receive up to 12 months of back rent, 3 months of future rent, and utility assistance if they fell behind on rent since March 2020. ## **Excluded Worker Fund**

■ New Yorkers can receive up to \$15,600 in direct cash assistance if they were ineligible for unemployment benefits or federal COVID-related income relief due to their immigration status or other factors.
