NYC Health + Hospitals is expanding its lung cancer screening program from five to 10 sites by the end of this year, creating the capacity to serve 5,000 patients annually.

The system offers the screening — which involves a low-dose computerized tomography scan — to patients who are between the ages of 50 and 80, have a history of heavy smoking, are currently using tobacco or stopped within the past 15 years, and have no signs or symptoms of underlying lung cancer.
