


Based on patient self-report to CHS regarding housing status prior to incarceration and/or anticipated housing status after incarceration.

Anticipated to have Medicaid coverage upon release from custody based on patients noted to have suspended coverage or for whom CHS has submitted a new application.

#### Mental Health, Substance Use, and Chronic Medical Conditions, by History<sup>1</sup>



1. Based on documentation of history and/or active use disorder or condition.

2. Includes individuals who are currently enrolled or have been enrolled in the mental health service during their incarceration.

3. Based on diagnosis of bipolar and related disorders, schizophrenia spectrum and other psychotic disorders, depressive disorders, and post-traumatic stress disorder as described in The Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, 5th ed. (DSM-5) or individuals who do not meet the above diagnostic criteria but experience severe functional impairment or clinical distress as a result of a DSM-5 diagnosis.
